Some Reminders About Lunch Expectations

Now that the weather has improved, it is a good idea to remind students and parents about what is expected at lunchtime.

Home for Lunch: Some students go home to eat lunch. This option is available as long as parents have provided written consent to their child's teacher. If going home for lunch will be a daily occurrence, one signed note indicating the duration, (September - June 30, 2018) is acceptable. If going home for lunch is occasional, parents are asked to sign and date notes for each occurrence.

It is expected that parents of students in grades K-4 are picked up for lunch and returned by the parent. If the parent consents to have their older child, (grades 5-7) walk home for lunch on their own, this needs to be included in the note to the teacher.

Sign out System for Safety

Students who leave to go home over the lunch hour must sign out and sign back in—a book is located in the office. This is a VSB safety requirement.

Off school property: Students are not permitted to leave the school to buy a lunch or eat away from the school grounds anywhere other than their own home. Notes are not accepted for this purpose. It is expected that students who need to buy a lunch may do so before arriving to school in the morning.

I forgot my lunch: Students who sometimes forget their lunch may request to phone their parent from the office and/or request a brown bag lunch from the office.

Staying at School for Lunch

Children who stay at school for lunch, are expected to follow our lunch expectations. We encourage families to pack a healthy snack and lunch. Primary students eat in the lunch room. Intermediate students (Grade 4-7) may eat outside on the picnic tables, in the carpeted area, or the lunchroom.
