Spring Break-What to Do With Two Weeks Off?

Spring Break is right around the corner and with it comes time to relax, recharge and reconnect. It is also an important time to encourage your children to play and to provide opportunities for both structured and unstructured play. This chart provides some information about the differences between the two and how to find a balance between them.

What Are Structured And Unstructured Activities?

Structured Activities

- occur at a specific time and place
- are organized and delivered by adults
- contribute to about 25% of kids' overall physical activity
- examples include playing on a sports team, taking swimming lessons or going to a gymnastics class

Unstructured Activities

- self-motivated and spontaneous play
- directed by children
- are reported by kids to be associated with fun, pleasure, choice and freedom
- examples include building a fort, climbing rocks or trees, splashing in puddles, playing hide and seek with friends

Finding Balance Between Structured and Unstructured Play

- Leave time for unstructured play. If you find your child does not have time to just play, consider taking something off the calendar.
- Ask your kids what they want to do! Encourage them to use their imagination.
- Look for outdoor play opportunities. Did you know that children are less likely to engage in bullying when they play in natural environments?
- Look for a variety of structured activities for your kids. Fundamental movement skills transfer from activity to activity, so it is important that kids have choices. Hang up the hockey skates at the end of winter and bring out the soccer ball.

Hold and Secure Drill-April 6-Why Do We Practice This?

In a Hold and Secure the exterior doors of the school are secured while normal activities continue inside the school. Hold and Secure is used to protect the school occupants from a danger in the neighbourhood or community outside the school. Examples: police incident in the neighbourhood, suspicious strangers on school playgrounds, protests/civil disturbances outdoors near schools, etc.


