## Student Learning Survey Results

Each year, students in Grades 4 and 7 complete the Student Learning Survey which is a survey produced by the B.C. Ministry of Education. The survey covers a range of topics, providing a comprehensive picture of the educational experience in B.C. public schools. Questions were developed with input from partner groups, teachers and experts in educational measurement and special education. Teachers conduct the survey and this year Mr. T. helped and took the students through the survey. We wanted to share some of the results with you and while it is good to keep in mind that the survey was just done with Grade 4's and 7's, it does give us a snapshot of how our students are feeling. As our school goals focus on Aboriginal Education and Social Emotional Learning, we are sharing results from those two areas. If you would like to see the full results, please see Ms. Biorn at the office.

Question	Grade 4	Grade 7
Do you feel welcome at your school?	80 % (most or all of the time)	65% (most or all of the time)
At your school, how many adults do you feel care about you? (for example, teachers, counsellors, support staff)	3 or more (65%)	3 or more (55%)
Are you learning about First Peoples at school?	64% (most or all of the time)	45% (most or all of the time)
Does school make you feel stressed or worried?	36% (never or few times)	25% (at no time or few times)
At school, I am learning how to solve problems in peaceful ways	57% (most of the time or all of the time)	55% (agree or strongly agree)

As a staff, we will be looking at these results and incorporating them into our plans for our school goal. We will continue to work with our inquiry groups and discuss areas of growth and ways to improve.
