Lates, Absences and Vacations

The office would like to remind parents of the Safe Arrival procedures.

If your child will be absent or late from school, please call **604-713-5159 extension 59** to report this absence or late as early as possible. Parents should leave a message at the dedicated answering service, please state your childs first and last name and reason for late or absence. It is important to report your child's absence or late prior to 9:30 a.m.

As well, if your child is late, even by 5 or 10 mins, remind them to come to the office to sign in. Some teachers will have already done attendance and have marked your child absent. You may get a phone call home if your child does not sign in as it is the office that updates all the lates on the attendance.

In regards to Vacations or leaves, please send a note to the office. Advising the teacher alone is not enough. Teachers do not enter long-term or pre-arranged absences. Teachers only do day to day attendance.

Particularly help them to understand the teachers comments and provide encouragement for their success. Taking a generally positive approach and finding ways to encourage children in their successes is the best way to help your child improve and be even more successful. 

On February 6th at 11:00 am there will be a Lion Dance performance at Nightingale to celebrate Lunar New Year. This traditional celebration goes back about one thousand years. In fact, the first performance dates back to early Ch'in and Han Dynasties. Traditionally the lion is regarded as a guardian creature expressing joy and happiness. There are essentially two styles of lion dance: Northern (北獅) which used to be performed for imperial courts and Southern (南獅) was performed for ceremonies to summon luck and fortune. We would like to wish everyone "Gung Hay Fat Choy" / "Chúc Mừng Năm Mới" and would also like to thank Lin Linn for decorating our office space.
