FRANKLIN CODE OF CONDUCT

You may be aware that we have a new school code of conduct. The new code of conduct document will be included in the school opening package that will be sent home with your child. We hope you will have a chance to take a look at the new code of Conduct with your child. We will review the school Code of Conduct at our monthly school assembly and work with our students to promote and develop an awareness of our school motto “**Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Fair**”. Look out for Code of Conduct Posters in our school and classrooms. I would like to thank Ms. Myers and Franklin staff members for developing our new School Code of Conduct.



STUDENT INFORMATION VERIFICATION

The student information package included a student verification sheet, emergency contact information and the names of people to whom we may release your child. If any of this information has changed, please contact the office to update it. Please remember to notify the office if you change your telephone number(s), house address or email address throughout the school year so that we are able to update our records. Packages will be sent home to new families the week of September 18th; please verify all information, complete the forms and return it to school.

FORMS AND SCHOOL FEES

Early next week a package will go home with all students. It will contain the school calendar and information about school fees and agendas, as well as media consent forms and other important forms. Please look for it, read through the information and sign and return it to school as soon as possible.

VOLUNTEER DRIVER FORMS

If you are thinking about volunteering to drive for a field trip or for any sport teams this year, you will need to complete a Volunteer Driver Registration and Approval Form. This form can be obtained from the office and is valid for one school year, so if you completed one in June, you will need to fill out another form. It is best to complete the form before the field trip as the Principal must sign the form and approve each volunteer driver before they are allowed to drive any students for school related activities.

Please note the following in regards to the approval process:

- one form must be completed for each driver
- the owner of the vehicle must sign the form
- you will need to show your driver's license when you bring in the completed form
- by signing the form, you are certifying that you have had no moving violations, no impaired driving charges and no criminal charges related to a motor vehicle in the past 24 months

In regards to driving students the following rules apply:

- no child under the age of 13 is allowed to sit in the front passenger seat of a vehicle that has an air bag
- no child between 40-80 lbs or until a height of 4'9" tall, or age 9 can travel in a car without a booster seat

STUDENT SUPERVISION

Adult supervision is provided from 8:40 until the warning bell at 8:55am. and from 3:00 to 3:20pm. During recess and lunch, VSB supervision aides supervise the playground and lunchroom. It is our expectation and the Vancouver Board of Education policy that students respect safety rules and follow Franklin's Code of Conduct at all times.

REVERSE LUNCH: At Franklin, we have a Reverse Lunch, which means that our students play at the beginning of the lunch break and eat at the end of it. Teachers of younger students work with the children to ensure that they have an opportunity to eat something before the lunch break and then finish after play. Franklin students bring lunch from home and eat in the lunchroom, or are welcome to go home for lunch. If your child is staying at school for lunch, please provide your child with sufficient healthy snacks, drinks and lunch meals for a day of intense learning and playing.

STUDENT SIGN OUT POLICY

Once the children arrive at school, they remain under the care of the school staff until the end of the day. Please be advised that students need to be signed out at the office if they need to leave the school during the school day.

PARKING/DROP OFF PROCEDURES

We have worked with the Neighbourhood Parking and Transportation Branch of the City of Vancouver over the years to improve the traffic flow and safety for student drop off and pick up. Please note:

- Parents are asked to drive in a clockwise direction around the school to ensure the flow of traffic and so that students are not crossing the street in front of cars.
- 3 MINUTE PARKING areas have been established on Pandora, Kootenay and Franklin streets to allow for student drop off on the school side of the streets.
- NO STOPPING ANY TIME signs are for the safety of all children. Please respect them.
- Resident permit parking zones allow for stopping for up to five minutes if the driver remains in the vehicle.



*For the safety of the children, please drive carefully and obey traffic signs around school grounds
The following are traffic signs that are typically posted around Vancouver schools.*



“NO STOPPING 8am - 5pm SCHOOL DAYS”

These signs designate the zones where vehicles are not permitted to stop under circumstances. These zones are kept clear to provide good sight lines for drivers: see students and students to see drivers.



“NO PARKING 8am - 5pm SCHOOL DAYS”

These signs designate the zones for active picking up and dropping off of students. Do not park and leave the vehicle in these zones.



School Area Signs

This sign is used in advance of school to warn drivers that children may be walking along or crossing the road. On local streets 30 km/hr signs are posted and speed limit is 30 km/hr from 8am - 5pm on school days.



School Crosswalk Signs

A school crosswalk sign indicates where children will be crossing the road. Vehicles must yield to pedestrians at all intersections and crosswalks. Vehicles must remain stopped until children are safely across and on the curb. Please remember children are playful and impulsive and may enter the roadway suddenly.



SAFETY DRILLS

Various safety drills will be reviewed and practiced regularly throughout the year, including fire, earthquake, lockdown (building intruder) and hold and secure and shelter in place (external concern)



that may impact the school). Students will be prepared in advance and will be informed of upcoming drills at **the beginning of the school year**. These safety drills allow us to assess our level of preparedness and make adjustments to better prepare in case of an emergency. Students are expected to follow instructions quickly and quietly during drills, exercising the safe practices that have been taught.
