Talent Show

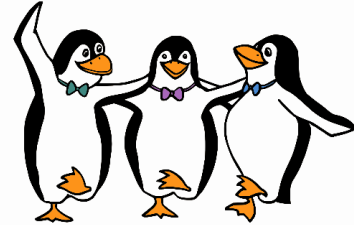

Safe Arrival

Thank you to all the families that have been following the new procedures for reporting absences and signing students in and out. Student safety is always a top priority.

Starting Monday, March 5 students that arrive late to school must report to the office before attending class. In addition, if you are aware that your child will be away (appointment, trip etc.) please inform the office and not the classroom teacher.

If your child will be absent from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible or prior to 9am on day of absence. Parents should leave a message on a dedicated answering service by calling **604-713-5159**. This will prompt you to enter our school's 2-digit extension number which is **#47**. School offices are busy places: consistently notifying the school in advance of your child's absence will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival Morning Routine.

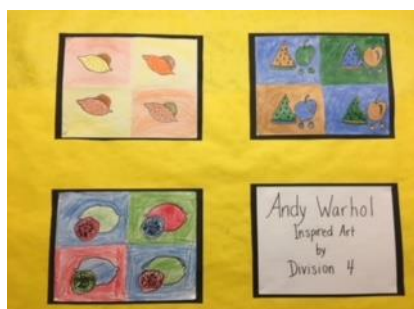
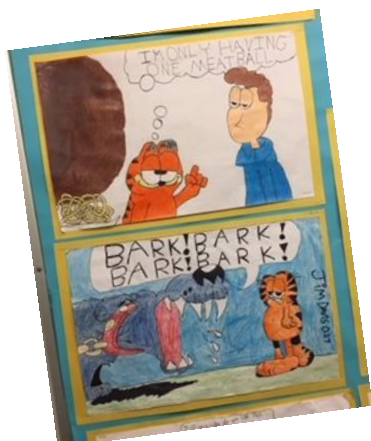
I AM THE BRAVE.
