Kindergarten registration for children born in 2013 begins on November 1st.

All Kindergarten applicants are required to submit an application to their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for choice programs (French Immersion, Montessori, etc.) and/or a cross boundary placement.

The priority registration period for Kindergarten opens on **Wednesday November 1st and closes at 4 pm on Wednesday January 31st**. Students who submit an application within this priority period will be accommodated before late applicants.

In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than the school can accommodate the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:



Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1st and January 31st

1. In-catchment Kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a **random draw** for the remaining Kindergarten spaces.
3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.
4. Between January 31st and the second Friday in June students on the ordered waitlist will be accommodated as space becomes available.

Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment Kindergarten students who apply **after** January 31st will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist.

Note: There will be **no priority** given to registrants with siblings if they register after January 31st.

When registering your child please bring:

1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
2. Child's birth certificate
3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
4. Immunization records

If you wish to apply for a Choice program or cross-boundary, you must first apply to your English catchment elementary school. Applications for Choice programs and cross boundary placements will be accepted in early 2018.

Grade 7 Mini School Information

The process for applying for Mini schools is soon approaching. Here is some important information on the Mini School application process.

Important Dates

REGISTER ONLINE for the test..... Oct. 27 to Nov. 9, 2017

Test date and time..... Nov. 21 at 1:00 p.m., 2017

(Students with a designated Special Need and IEP take test at 9 a.m. at VSB Ed. Centre)

Application to programs deadline Dec. 21, 2017 by 3 p.m.

All 18 secondary schools in Vancouver offer challenging and comprehensive programs. Many schools have developed their own school-based enrichment programs for a wide range of student interests and abilities. In addition to the neighbourhood school, District programs also offer a set of enrichment programs to meet the needs of students.

To apply for most District programs, students must complete the **District Cognitive Skills test on Nov. 21, 2017**.

Remembrance Day Assembly

There will be a Remembrance Day assembly on Wednesday, November 8th at 11:10 a.m. Parents are welcome to attend. School will not be in session on Friday, November 10 (Curriculum Implementation Day) as well as Monday, November 13 (in lieu of Remembrance Day).

Communicating Student Learning

Many Vancouver Public Schools, along with schools throughout British Columbia, are moving from a model of 'reporting to parents' on a regular and pre-determined schedule to 'communicating student learning with parents' on an on-going basis throughout the school year. This year, the teachers in our school will be participating in a district-initiated pilot project along with other Vancouver schools and their teachers. These teacher teams will work with the school district to provide parents with timely and responsive communications of student learning throughout the school year. Parents with children in these classes will receive five communications from teachers within a school year:

- a written progress report at the end of January
- a written summative report at the end of June
- a minimum of three ongoing communications of student learning in various subject areas.

The written reports will include descriptive comments and a summary of student progress in relation to the learning standards from the BC Curriculum. Detailed information about these changes will be sent home to parents/guardians if your child's teacher is involved in this pilot project.

Emergency Procedures



Fire Drills and Earthquakes

This month we participated in an Earthquake Drill and a Fire Drill. Every year schools practice Emergency Procedure Drills (Fire, Earthquake, Lockdown, Hold and Secure) throughout the year. All schools are required to facilitate drills and some require us to vacate the building to simulate real emergency procedures. Knowing what to do and where to go is extremely important and calming information for students to be aware of.

Although staff speak to students to prepare them for these events, it would be beneficial for families of younger and/or sensitive students to discuss this at home as well.



Cross Country

Congratulations to all the members of the Cross Country Team. They practiced twice a week for 5 weeks, competed in 3 mini-meets at Clinton Park and came out to a rescheduled final meet at Trout Lake. At every practice and meet the students supported and cheered for each other and demonstrated qualities of respect and fair play. Thank you to all the family members who ran with the team at practices, helped with ribbons at Clinton Park and drove students to events. It was a pleasure to coach this team.

Lockdown, Hold and Secure



What is a Lockdown?

A Lockdown code results in a full lockdown of all rooms within the school and is initiated when potentially life-threatening violent events are occurring inside the school. Staff and students secure themselves in rooms or hide or, if a secure option is not available, evacuate from a high risk/insecure area. All regular school activities cease and the students will not be allowed to leave their locked classrooms until it is safe to do so.

What is a Hold and Secure?

Formerly known as a code yellow, Hold and Secure is the action of holding students and staff safely inside a school when there is a known danger or threat outside of the school. This could be an altercation in the neighbourhood, an intruder on school grounds, or even a bear or coyote on the playground. Under Hold and Secure, all perimeter/exterior doors of the school are locked and no persons are to enter or leave the school once it is underway. Normal functions are maintained in the school. Students may not even notice any difference, especially if it doesn't happen during a time when they would be outdoors.

Lockdown and Hold and Secure Background

Hold and Secure and Lockdown procedures are events involving a known danger or threat outside the school or potentially life-threatening violent events which are occurring inside the school. In general if there is someone who doesn't appear to have a legitimate purpose to be on the school grounds and you are concerned, talking to the office is appropriate. Someone on duty will then approach the person as long as they don't appear threatening. This lets them know that their presence is noted. They will usually ask for directions and leave, or let the staff know who they are and whether they do have a reason to be on school grounds. Intruders who are persistent but not dangerous may need a verbal warning from the Principal. A dangerous intruder is someone whose behaviour suggests a threat. In that case they are not to be approached directly and word should be passed on to the school office.

Signing In and Out



Student Sign Out Procedure

When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you sign them out at the school office, **even if the classroom teacher is aware**. If there is an emergency and you do not sign out your child, they will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds. If the school staff do not locate the child, and are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school will call the Vancouver Police Department. Therefore, clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches. Thank you for helping us keep your children safe!

Reporting Student Absences:

Student safety is of paramount importance at the Vancouver School District. Ensuring student safety is a shared responsibility. In order to assist schools, we ask parents to notify schools of student absences. If your child will be absent from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message on a dedicated answering service by calling 604-713 5159. This will prompt you to enter our school's 2-digit extension number which is #47. Messages will be received before the office is open. School offices are busy places: consistently notifying the school in advance of your child's absence will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival Morning Routine. To Report Your Child's Absence – Please Call **the number** above prior to 9 am on the first day of the absence. Please keep this information posted in an easy, accessible area.

The school will let you know if there are any changes to this new system.
