

Emergency Drills We are obligated to have several drills throughout the year: Fire, Earthquake, Hold and Secure (formerly Code Yellow) – the outside doors are locked so no one can enter or leave for the duration of the drill, but normal activities continue inside the school (we will put signs on main entrances to inform the public)

Lockdown – during this drill, students stay or go into the closest locking room. Lights are turned off and blinds are closed. Everyone sits out of sight, in total silence until the drill is over.

Staff have spoken to all students not only about procedures but also the reason behind having the drills, explain that everyone will be safe and they should not worry about anything.

**Please reassure your children that they are safe but we need to practice these drills in order to be prepared in case anything should arise. We will be practicing these drills this week. An announcement will be made before Hold & Secure and Lockdown drills reassuring the students that this is only a drill.

Bullying, bullying can be in many different forms and all of the forms hurts. For example, I was teasing around with my friends, making unnecessary comments. It's ok to make a few, but after a while, things get bad. I then realized I can hurt others with just a few words. I also realized People are being bullied and sometimes they have trouble expressing it, or afraid and embarrassed telling the truth and stand up for themselves. Over the course of time, they might start to be isolated and it can make children unhappy and frightened. It can make them feel unsafe and think there must be something wrong with them. Children can lose confidence and may not want to go to school anymore. But school should be a place for kids to learn, practice their ability and have fun at the same time. Children should not feel unsafe or unhappy going to school. I should not be taking away the joy from other people and making them not wanting to go to school. We should all make school a lively and fun-loving place for kids to learn and have fun. We can start off with being nice – no bullying. I can sit down with a student and listen or talk to them just for a few minutes of my day. That few minutes can be very valuable to that person. It can make them feel like someone cares and help them have a better life.

Bullying, bullying appears everywhere. On the playground, in class and even at home. Last week I found out that I was bullying a kid in my class. No one thought of it that way as it was just an on-going joke. But even things so subtle can make an impact on someone's life. Even if you are just joking around, not trying to hurt anybody, there is usually someone being affected by whatever you are doing or saying. So next time you are just trying to make a joke, think of this, "What if the joke was on me? Would I feel bad? Angry? Or even scared? So when you make a joke, just think twice about it.


