**CROSS-BOUNDARY APPLICATIONS** If you are interested in having your child attend an English school that is not your catchment school, you may want to consider our cross-boundary application process that begins **February 1<sup>st</sup>** and will end **February 28<sup>th</sup>**. If you are applying outside your catchment area, it is important for you to know that your child will only be considered once all other in-catchment students have been considered.

### **KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION 2018-2019: Do you have a child born in 2013?**

All Kindergarten applicants are required to submit an application to their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for choice programs (French Immersion, Mandarin Bilingual, Montessori, etc.) and/or a cross boundary placement.

**Last Day:** The priority registration period for Kindergarten opened on **Tuesday November 1<sup>st</sup>** and will close at **4 pm on Wednesday January 31<sup>st</sup>**. Students who submit an application within this priority period will be accommodated **before** late applicants.

In a few Vancouver schools there may be more in-catchment applicants than the school can accommodate. For those schools, applicants who applied within the priority registration period (November 1 to January 31) will be included in a draw for available spaces. Students with siblings already in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed prior to the draw.

When registering your child please bring:

1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
2. Child's birth certificate
3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
4. Immunization records

If your child was born outside of Canada, you need to report to the **VSB District Reception and Placement Centre (DRPC)** and complete the initial Kindergarten application there.

If you want to apply for a Choice program or cross-boundary, you must first apply to your English catchment elementary school. Applications for **Choice programs will be accepted from January 15<sup>th</sup> to February 5<sup>th</sup>**, but only after you have registered at your catchment school.

**SATISFACTION SURVEY:** The Provincial Satisfaction Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents, teachers and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective. Throughout February, March & April, the Satisfaction Survey will be administered to students in grades 4 and 7, their parents, and all school staff. We encourage parents to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement.
