#### Dear Queen Mary Community,

The recent inclement weather kept our building engineers busy ensuring that enough salt was spread, and that all walkways were cleared. Thank you for a job well done! The weather also brings home the importance of abiding by parking regulations around Queen Mary. While there is only a limited area for parents to drop off their children, bylaws allow for a 5 minute period to park and drop. If everyone abides by this bylaw, a steady flow of drop offs can work well. Often however, we see cars parking for up to 15 minutes waiting for children to be dismissed from school. This prolonged parking causes major problems for other parents, as well as for residents in the neighbourhood who find their alleys and side roads blocked by parents who cannot get near the school due to others who have parked for longer than the allotted 5 minutes. Please work with us to make drop off and pick up less of a nightmare for all parents and students.

Our Pink Day Assembly was a great success. Thank you to Ms. Ho and Division 6 for hosting. Our 'buddy benches' were introduced via some clever skits performed by a variety of QM students. The idea of the buddy bench is that any child who doesn't have a friend to play with, or who may be feeling a little down, can sit there and expect to be approached by a friendly face at recess or lunch. We look forward to seeing all students continuing to develop friendships at school.

#### **PARENT CORNER & PAC EVENTS: Our next PAC meeting is March 13<sup>th</sup> at 7p.m.**

Queen Mary staff and students would like to thank PAC for our PINK day t-shirts. We all wore them for the PINK day assembly on the 27<sup>th</sup>. The ideas behind Pink Day are near and dear to us and we continue year round with our anti-bullying, inclusivity and acceptance themed projects and conversations in the classroom and on the playground. Thank you PAC for supporting us!

PAC has arranged for a First Aid Course for our grade 6 & 7 students. The training will take place over 5 hours on March 9<sup>th</sup>. The subsidized cost is just \$20 per student, and students who are unable to pay the fee for any reason will be covered by PAC. The Canadian Red Cross 'Stay Safe' course is outlined below, and is provided by Pacific First Aid. Our long-term goal is to see this course take place every second year so that every QM student leaves elementary with the ability to react to an emergency situation.

“Stay Safe” - Canadian Red Cross course teaches 9-13 year olds how to stay safe at home and in the community. First Aid elements include recovery position, conscious choking, asthma, anaphylaxis (includes use of EpiPen), poisoning, stings, wound care (minor cuts, nose bleeds, burns, life-threatening bleeding).

**Pacific Autism Family Network event:** Raphael Samaniego, is a 2<sup>nd</sup> year dental student at UBC. Along with many fellow students, she has organized an event called Sharing Smiles. In short, it’s an event wherein children with various intellectual or physical disabilities are paired with dental students to engage in different activities. Some of these activities include sports, games, quizzes related to oral health, and coloring! We do this in the hopes of getting future dental professionals more familiar with this demographic, and in doing so, reducing the disparity these individuals face in terms of access to proper dental care. The event is at the **Pacific Autism Family Network on March 3<sup>rd</sup> from 10 AM – 2 PM**.
