Emergency Procedures

OVA is Allergy-Aware!

In the unlikely event of a threat to the school, we practice the following emergency procedures to be best prepared. These are rehearsed in addition to earthquake and fire

Lockdown: used in response to a dangerous assailant within the school,

Hold & Secure: used if there is a security concern in the neighbourhood.

Room Clear: used to move students away from a hazard contained in one room/area, and

Shelter in Place: used if an environmental hazard is in the vicinity of school.

Student Late Arrivals

Thank you to families for signing students in when arriving late and signing students out when picking up your children before school is dismissed.

We encourage all students to arrive on time each morning to minimize the disruptions late arrivals have on student learning – for both the student arriving late, and for the classroom that is impacted by a late arrival interruption.

Traffic Safety

Please be mindful of the street signage around the QVA school property.
