BCIT (British Columbia Institute of Technology- A Polytechnic Institution)

Each program is based on individual requirements and averages. Program entrance requirements include the level of English required (for e.g. English 12 C+ for some programs). In addition to the program specific English level requirements, applicants are assessed as **Category A or B**.

<http://www.bcit.ca/admission/english.shtml> . Category A -who have studied for two years full-time in a country where English is the primary language. Category B i- whose previous education is **not** from a country where English is the primary language or who have **not** completed two years of full-time education in English in non-English Second Language (ESL) / English as an Additional Language (EAL) courses. Category B students can meet the requirement in other ways. One -English 12 with the program specific grade and COMM 0033 at BCIT or TOEFL or IELTS.

Two distinct process of admission for Trades and Technology

Trades: Admission is mostly non-competitive. Students are on wait-list, first come, first served basis. While on the waitlist students can switch to other programs in trades without re-applying. Gr. 11 and 12 students can apply if requirements are met. Students are placed on the waitlist only when they meet the requirements. But students can take the Trades Pre-Entry Tests to get on the waitlist, even though they have not yet graduated. <http://www.bcit.ca/tlc/pretest/>

Technology Diploma and Degree: Competitive selection process, specific intake usually in September with applications accepted from Nov. of the previous year. Some programs have two intakes. No waitlist, applications are not transferred to subsequent intakes. Students must reapply.

Technology Entry (TE) – <http://www.bcit.ca/study/programs/0090000000>

Ideal for students who want solid academic preparation before entering a BCIT program and who are missing two or more prerequisites. Provides academic upgrading for students to enter a BCIT Technology Program. Entrance requirements: English 11 (50%) and English language proficiency, Principles of Math 11(60%) or BCIT math competency testing or Pre-Calculus 11 (60%). Foundations of Mathematics 11 is not acceptable.

Trades Discovery (General) and Trades Discovery for Women

Students gain hands-on experience in 20 different technical and trades fields.

Submission of Marks -submit all documentation online when you apply. All documents need to be scanned or saved as PDF (Portable Document Format) files. Follow up with mid-term marks & final marks. <http://www.bcit.ca/admission/requirements/documents.shtml>. Page 1

University Transfer Programs (Arts and Science Programs)

1. BC Secondary School Graduation (Grade 12) or equivalent with a **minimum GPA of 2.0 (60%) calculated on English 12 or English 12 First Peoples and three academic Gr. 12 courses** selected from Accounting/Financial Accounting 12, Applications of Math12, Applications of Physics12, BC First Nations Language 12, BC First Nations Studies 12, Biology12, Calculus12, Chemistry12, Comparative Civilization12, Economics12, English Literature12, Entrepreneurship 12, Foundation of Math12, Francais-Langue Seconde 12 or French12, Geography12, Geology12, German12, History12, Information Technology12 or one of ICTC12, ICTM12, ICTP12, ICTS12, ICTX12, Japanese12, Korean 12, Law12, Marketing 12, Mandarin12, Philosophy12, Philosophy and Religion 12, Physics 12, Pre-Calculus 12 or Principles of Mathematics12, Physics12, Psychology12, Punjabi12, Social Justice 12, Spanish12, Sustainable Resources12, Writing12 **or**
2. Successful completion of the BC. Adult Dogwood Graduation Diploma **or**
3. Successful completion of the General Education Diploma (GED) **or**
4. Mature student status (Discretionary Admission): Applicants who are 20 years of age or older and lack the minimum admission requirements. Applicants should provide details of other qualifications or experiences and an academic transcript of education. An interview may be required.

Career Programs/Limited Enrolment: High School Graduation is the usual prerequisite. Some applicants may enter programs without graduation because of other qualifications and experience. Some programs may request an interview, testing, audition, portfolio or specific academic courses.

Adult Basic Education Program at Capilano University <http://www.capilanou.ca/requirements/>

Applicants to the Adult Basic Education program should be at least 18 years old and have been out of the public school system for at least one year. Exceptions will be made only with departmental approval. While there is no educational prerequisite for entering the ABE program, placement in courses is based upon an assessment of writing and mathematical skills. Courses are tuition free.

English Language Proficiency: If English is **not your first language** or you have received your education in another language, then proficiency is met by one of the following tests:

TOEFL 220 computer based, 560 paper based score, 83 internet based, or ELA 145 or IELTS 6.5 overall, and no one score less than 6, PTE (academic) 56 or CAEL 70. Or English 12 with a final mark (including provincial exam) of C+ or higher and two years of high school in Canada or LPI 4 with an essay score of 26 or four consecutive years of full time study in Canada (high school or post-secondary) or in a country other than Canada where English is the principle language, Capilano University EAP 100 and 101 with a minimum mark of B+ (77%).

English Requirement for all students to enrol in first-year English course: LPI or Capilano College English Diagnostic Test (EDT) or interim or final grade of 75% or higher in English 12, English Literature 12, or English 12 First Peoples. Students with LPI score of 5 or 6 on essay can register in any English course. Score of 4, English 100 is recommended, score of 3 English 010 required, score of 1- EAP. <http://www.capilanou.ca/english/English-Diagnostic-Test/> and <http://www.capilanou.ca/english/LPI-Score-Placement/>

Math Placement Test: Students who wish to enroll in Algebra, Pre Calculus, Statistics or Calculus courses may be required to take the Math Placement Test (MPT) before registration to ensure appropriate placement. Note: Course Registration based on GPA of English 12 and three Gr. 12 courses used in admission.

Admission to the Programs:

Open Enrolment Programs (General Admission): General Studies, Criminology, Arts, Sciences, and most university transfer programs. Enrolment is "open", because there is no limit on the number of open enrolment students that the college can accept. Applicants must meet the College's General Admission Requirements. Early application is recommended. Admission does not guarantee course registration. Course registration time based on GPA(English 12, Math 11 and one academic course). Students who don't have Math 11 will be assigned a late registration based on application date.

Limited Enrolment Programs: Have an application deadline date. Must meet all general and program-specific admission criteria. Candidates will be selected for admission on a first-qualified, first-admitted basis, except where a program has an admission process that first ranks each candidate within the pool of qualified candidates, then selects candidates based on their rank order (highest to lowest). Date of qualification is used if rankings are tied. Some Limited Enrolment Programs are Nursing, Early Childhood Education, Dental Assisting etc. which can accommodate only a limited number of students. Spaces must be confirmed by payment of a non-refundable, non-transferable deposit.

General Admission Requirements to the College- Need **ONE** of the following criteria:

- Successful completion of BC secondary school graduation or equivalent in another school system **or**
- One course short of BC secondary school graduation **or**
- Is 19 years old by the end of the first month of the first semester of attendance **or**
- Is at least 17 years of age on the first day of the first semester of attendance and have not been enrolled at a school for at least one year **or**
- Completion of a certificate or equivalent from a special needs program and has been in school for 12 years **AND**

Meets the Language Proficiency Requirement

- English 12 with a minimum final grade of C (including provincial exam) or
- Communications 12 - min. "B" final grade (based on course mark and provincial exam)
- English Literature 12 - min. "C" grade
- English 12 First People C final grade
- LPI - min. score 4
- TOEFL - 83 internet-based iBT
- IELTS (Academic module only)- min. overall band test score 6.5
- Douglas College English Assessment
- ENGU 0350 & 0360 Mastery, etc. at Douglas College

Students without this level of English-language proficiency are not admissible to College-level courses and programs but can register in Douglas College upgrading courses.

Students who don't meet one of the above requirements may apply as a "**special student**". Course registration is based on date of application.

English requirement to take college/ university level writing intensive courses need English 12 with a B or LPI with 5 on **both** Essay Level **and** English Usage **and** a score of 10 on the Reading Comprehension section.

First Year Foundation Academic Requirements

Applicants from BC and Yukon: Grade 12 graduation with an overall grade point average of 2.5 (C+ or 67%) calculated on five subjects as per the following list:

- ◆ English 12 or First Peoples English 12 (a minimum grade of 60% or 'C' is required)
- ◆ Two other grade 12 academic courses chosen from English Literature 12, History 12, Other Language 12, Comparative Civilizations 12, Geography 12, Geology 12, BC First Nations Studies 12, Biology 12, Chemistry 12, Apprenticeship and Workplace Math 12, Principles of Mathematics 12, Pre Calculus 12, Foundations of Math 12, Calculus 12, Physics 12, American Sign Language 12, Conservatory Canada 12, Royal Conservatory Music 12, Psychology 12, Law 12, Writing 12 (Creative, Journalism or Media), Marketing 12, Economics 12, Accounting 12, Applications of Mathematics 12, Communications 12, Technical & Professional Communications 12.
- ◆ Two electives. All elective courses must be grade 12 and can be Ministry Approved, Board Approved or Locally Developed.

Portfolio Guidelines (Must submit online at SlideRoom) National Portfolio Day Dec. 5, 2015. Students only can attend. Students can pre-register. Preregistration does not guarantee a place at the institution of student's choice. Admission at the entrance is on first come, first served basis.

Portfolio, essay and resume are general requirements for Foundation applicants. Admission will be based on a score comprised portfolio and GPA calculated on 5 Grade 12 subjects.

English Proficiency Requirement for Admission:

Applicants whose first language is not English, regardless of immigration or citizenship status must present one of the following English Proficiency tests:

- TOEFL iBT Internet Based Test- minimum score of 84 out of 120 total points including a minimum score in each of the four skills: Speaking 20/30, Reading 20/30, Writing 18/30 and Listening 20/30
- CAEL Canadian Academic English Language Assessment Test- minimum level of 70 overall
- IELTS International English Language Testing System- level 6.5 with no band less than 6.0
- MELAB Michigan English Language Assessment Battery- minimum level of 81

Exemptions:

- Three years of full-time education in Canada or the equivalent in another country where English is the principle language of instruction which excludes ESL English studies.

LPI cannot be used as an exemption for the TOEFL requirement.

English Requirement to take first year English courses at Emily Carr- Language Proficiency Index (LPI) not a requirement: Accepted students might have to take Emily Carr's English test.

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Must satisfy applicant category and Faculty/Program Admission Requirements

Applicant Categories: All applicants must be in one of the categories:

Regular Applicant: Graduate of a BC secondary school or the equivalent. Short by one course for graduation are also eligible, provided they have passed Eng. 12 or Comm. 12 with a C+ grade, **or**

Mature Student: who have not graduated from a secondary school or equivalent, but will be 19 years of age or older on the first day of attendance at Kwantlen **or**

General Interest Applicant Category: Complete up to a maximum of 12-credits, must achieve a passing grade in every course. Who successfully complete 12 credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 and satisfy the English proficiency requirement may re-apply under the Special Entry category..

Special Entry : Completed 12 credits with a CGPA of 2.0 and who have demonstrated they satisfy KPU's English proficiency requirement are eligible for admission.

Students must meet one of KPU's applicant categories in addition to:

- 1. FACULTY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS** for open intake areas of study OR
- 2. PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS** for direct-entry admission to limited intake programs

Open Intakes- A limit HAS NOT been set on the number of students admitted.

Limited Intakes- Has a limit HAS been set on the number of students admitted.

Upgrading

Applicants who are unable to satisfy undergraduate admission requirements may be eligible for admission to a Faculty Pathway program. For additional information, see kpu.ca/pathway.

English Proficiency: All **undergraduate applicants must have** one of the following:

- C+ average in English 12, English Literature 12, English 12 First Peoples
- A in Communications 12
- LPI essay score 30 or higher and level 5
- Kwantlen Placement Test (EPT) with placement into ENGL 1100
- TOEFL internet based 88 with no sub score less than 20 (taken in last two years)
- IELTS Academic Module score of 6.5 with a minimum of 6 in each band(in last 2 years)
- Pathway Program: Students who are not eligible can do to a pathway. kpu.ca/pathways.

Provincial Exam: Need provincial in English 12 or Comm. 12 . The blended grade (classroom + provincial exam mark) or classroom grade only, whichever is higher be used for (1) university admission, (2) program admission, and (3) satisfying course prerequisites.

General Admission Requirements (For Open Enrolment Programs)

1. Successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent (conditional admission may be considered if missing only one course for Grade 12 graduation, be currently enrolled in the missing course and maintaining mid term 60% average. Mid terms marks from summer school or adult ed. must be sent to Langara Registrar's office in the first week of August 2014. Otherwise, students will be taken out of classes. Domestic Students: students can apply for conditional admission even if they are one course short for graduation (including English or Comm. 12). International Students: can apply for conditional admission if they are one course short for graduation (this can be English or Comm. 12 provided they meet the English admission requirement by June through LPI, LET, TOEFL etc.) or
2. Successful completion of Adult Basic Education (ABE) or GED or
3. Only domestic students (not international), at least 19 years of age by the first day of the first semester of attendance. (However for course registration, students must meet course pre-requisites)

Career and Limited Enrolment Programs

In addition to general admission requirements, may require prog. specific supplements. LPI/LET or exemption is an entrance requirement for Career Programs.

Nursing: From Jan 2017 intake- A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.33 on five courses required for admission and minimum "C+" grade in English 1127 or 1128; English 1129 or 1130; Biology 1190, Biology 1191 and Statistics 1124 with a minimum "C+" grade or Statistics 1123 with a minimum "A" grade To meet program requirements BIOL 1190 and 1191, or equivalents must be completed at the same institution. No electives. Competitive admission. No waitlist. Preference may be given to applicants with higher GPA or a Bachelor's or higher degree.

English Language Requirement: (Not an entrance requirement for Open Enrolment- Arts and Science University Transfer Programs) To enroll in first semester English or Communications course or certain Biology and Philosophy courses, students must take the Langara English Test (LET with a minimum score of 3) or LPI with a minimum of 26/40 on the Essay and one of the following: 5 in English Usage, 5 in Sentence Structure or 10 in Reading Comprehension. Exemption: English 12/ English Literature 12/English 12 First Peoples or equivalent with a minimum 80% (for English 12-final grade after the provincial).Otherwise students will be placed into upgrading courses. A minimum C grade in a university level English course for which Langara awards credit or an S in one of Engl 1107, 1108 or 1110. Students have to pay for the upgrading courses.

Math and Science Requirements: Must be completed within the last three years.

Diagnostic Tests: Students who don't have the pre-requisites can challenge the diagnostic tests. Langara has tests for English, Math, Chemistry and Physics. No diagnostic test for Biology.

Langara English for Academic Purposes (LEAP) over 19 years of age, have some high school pre-requisites but need English skills and for high school graduates from another country.

Provincial exam for High School: Langara will use only the final blended grade for English 12.

Interim Marks: Current Gr. 12 students must complete the PSI selections by April 30, 2016 in order to register for courses in June.

Final document deadline: August 2016 to receive final marks through PSI online form.

Note: Admission and course registration based on date of application. Apply from Oct. 1 2015.

Students who register on Oct. 1 are placed in the first cohort for course registration. Page 7

Admission requirements vary by program and may in some cases include assessment or interviews; some programs have a competitive selection process and/or require a portfolio. Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

University Transfer Programs /Courses:

1.First-year University Transfer Computing Science and Software Systems Certificate-Students will gain transfer credits to the second year of the SFU Computing Science and Software System programs.

Admission Requirements:

- Grade 12 graduation or equivalent;
- English 12 with a 'C+' or greater and English Language Proficiency, or equivalent;
- Precalculus 12 with a B or: VCC Math 0983/0993 with a B, or VCC Math 1020 with a C, or, VCC Math Precalculus Assessment Test (MPT) with a 72%;
- One of the following: Physics 12 with a C+, or VCC Physics 0983/0993, or equivalent, or Chemistry 12 with a C+, or VCC Chemistry 0983/0993, or equivalent, or Biology 12 with a C+, or VCC Biology 0983/0993, or equivalent.

2.The First-year, University Transfer, Engineering Certificate- SFU Engineering Science transfer can be assured 2nd year Admission Pathway or Competitive. For UBC it's only competitive transfer to year 2.

Admission Requirements:

- Grade 12 graduation, or equivalent;
- English 12 with a 'C+' or greater and English Language Proficiency. For students who do not have English 12 with a C+, please see the 'English Language Proficiency Requirements for VCC' document for acceptable equivalencies;
- Precalculus 12 with a B or: ◦VCC Math 0983/0993 with a B, or ◦VCC Math 1020 with a C, or,
- ◦VCC Math Precalculus Test (MPT) with a B.
- Physics 12 with a C+, or VCC Physics 0983/0993 with a C+, or equivalent;
- Chemistry 12 with a C+, or VCC Chemistry 0983/0993 with a C+, or equivalent

3.First-year University courses

Admission Requirements: Grade 12 graduation, and English 12 with a 'C+' or greater or LPI with a score of 4 or Langara English Test (LET) with a 4 overall. Or VCC/ELA (English Language Assessment) with a score of 145 overall and 16/20 in essay, TOEFL- 82 overall on the Internet based test or IELTS 6.5 overall and no score less than 6.0

4.University Transfer Arts Certificate- Admission Requirements- same as above (3)

5. University Transfer Pathway to Health Sciences Certificate - prepare for a career in health sciences and to meet the pre-requisites for entrance into health sciences programs, including VCC's dental hygiene and nursing degree programs. Admission Requirements- same as above.

6. University Transfer Science Certificate- same as above. Page 8

Graduate from secondary school: Also meet faculty requirements and English language and literacy admission requirement and the quantitative and analytical skills requirement.

Special Admission: Diverse Qualifications. For students who meet SFU's minimum admission standard, have demonstrated commitment or excellence in other endeavours or have succeeded in their studies in spite of difficult circumstances. 10% of new students are selected from here.

All applicants regardless of country of origin or citizenship status, must demonstrate competence and in the English language prior to admission, in one of the following ways:

1. Completion of last three years of full time secondary education in English in Canada (including ESL English) or in a country where the principal language of instruction is English. A minimum blended grade of 60% or C in one of English 12, English Literature 12, or English 12 First Peoples, or their equivalents, is required. Note: a final, blended mark of 75% will permit enrollment in a writing-intensive (W) course.
2. IELTS minimum of 6.5 on the Academic Modules, min. of 6 in each of the 4 components
3. TOEFL IBT overall score 88 or better with a minimum of 20 in each of the four components

Final blended mark of 75% in English 12 or English Literature 12 or First Peoples or 60 to 74% and LPI with a grade of 4 or higher for the essay and at least 50% other sections or Foundations of Academic Literacy (FAL X99) course complete within first three enrolled terms.

Note: For admission: Students with less than a final mark (blended mark) of 60% in English 12 / English Lit. 12 or an English 12 First Peoples and 60% in Foundations of Math 11 or Pre-Calculus 11, or Foundations of Math 12 or Pre-Calculus 12 or Calculus 12 are not directly admitted to SFU from high school. They have to try through the college route.

Quantitative & English Literacy requirements must be met even by college transfer students.

New - Distributed Learning courses (online courses)- Distributed Learning (DL) courses (i.e. distance learning/online learning courses) can be used to meet your admission requirements provided 100% is completed by **April 30th**. Your DL provider must report your grade to the Ministry of Education to ensure SFU receives your official grade electronically in May. DL courses completed after April 30 can be used to meet course pre-requisites but not for admission purposes.

New- Upgrading/Repeat courses - If you repeat an approved grade 11 or 12 course the higher course mark will be used for admission, either your first course attempt or your new mark. If you have already graduated from high school and are upgrading courses an official, final course mark must be submitted to the Admissions office no later than **April 30th**.

***1 Quantitative Skills Requirements**

- Minimum final grade of 70% in one of the acceptable Grade 11 or Grade 12 math courses or its equivalent required to register in Q course.

- Students with 60-69% must either complete the Foundations of Academic Numeracy (FAN) course during first three semesters or take the Quantitative Placement Test

- A grade of C- in a 3 unit Math or certified Q (quantitative) course that transfers to SFU (for college and university transfer students).

***2 Language 11** beginner's language 11, American Sign Language 11 or 12, language 12 courses. Any language 11 or 12 course that is Ministry recognized & external language credit (Transfer Standing).

Math - Pre-Calculus 11 and Pre-Calculus 12 are required for Science and Business.

Pre-Calculus 11 or Foundations of Math 11 required for all Arts based programs.

Recommended to take Foundations of Math 12 for success in taking courses at the university.

NOTE: Only one of Foundations of Math 12 or Pre-Calculus 12 may be used in your GPA.

Challenge Courses and online courses: Accepted for GPA calculation.

Transfer Students: Less than 9 post secondary credits will be considered as high school student, credits 9 to 23, SFU will look at both high school and post-secondary marks, 24 or above only post-secondary credits will be considered.

You must demonstrate competence in the English language, regardless of your country of origin or citizenship status. This can be demonstrated by one of the following:

1. Three or more consecutive years of full-time education in English in Canada, including BC Grade 12 English or equivalent and can be a combination of secondary and post-secondary. If it includes regular BC Gr. 11 and 12 English, be three consecutive years, can include ESL.;or
2. Four or more consecutive years at an eligible international secondary school that uses English as the language of instruction **or**
3. A minimum final English grade of 70% or better on the provincial examination portion of BC English 12 or English Literature 12 or equivalent.
4. **TOEFL – Test of English as a Foreign Language:** Either the Paper-based test 55 with the Test of Written (TWE) 4.0 or the internet based test overall score 90/120 (reading 22, listening 22, writing 21 and speaking 21)
5. **IELTS- International English Language Testing System** (6.5 with no part less than 6.0)

Waiver from English language requirement for UBC's Vancouver campus official letter of recommendation from your school's English teacher, guidance counsellor, principal, or headmaster, which attests that your level of English proficiency is close to or equal to that of a native speaker.

Conditional Admission Program (CAP) For Vancouver Campus: offered through UBC's English Language Institute- For applicants who do not meet UBC's minimum English language admission standard for an undergraduate program. To qualify:

- strong academic record (apart from English language scores) and should rank in the top 50% of students admitted into the prior year's undergraduate program.
- met the minimum competence score for entry to the Conditional Admission Program

Students can apply to the CAP in their program choices. May take 6 weeks or longer depending on individual progress. Upon completion automatically placed in the degree program of their choice. Students can register for the courses in the regular degree program next fall.

AP Exams: Students can use the AP mark for GPA purpose even if they don't write the final exam. But students can claim credit for first year university course only if they challenge the final exam.

Challenge exams: (Course with a C code not acceptable even if provincial exam is written)

- Cannot be used in place of approved grade 12 courses in the calculation of their admission average.
- Still acceptable for Gr. 11 language admission requirement.
- Still acceptable to meet the second language degree requirement in the Faculty of Arts.
- In extenuating circumstances where a student must present a challenge exam mark for a required grade 12 math or science, contact UBC Undergraduate Admissions on a case-by-case basis.

24 credits and above: Will be treated as a transfer student. Only college marks. Students must check with UBC the latest information about transfer credits and admission requirements for students who have some post-secondary credits. (same for SFU)

Repeat Courses: UBC will make admission decisions based on interim mark of the repeat course or final mark of the first attempt whichever is higher.

Admission Decisions: UBC will evaluate students based on the marks self-reported from term 2 report card. Applicants who do not self-report their grades will not be considered for admission.

Provincial Exams - Applicants to UBC are required to write the BC Provincial Exams that are needed for graduation. BC Provincial Exam grades, including exams for English 12 or English 12 First Peoples, will be included only if they increase your admission average. First-Year English and the Language Proficiency Index Requirement UBC, Vancouver :

Most undergraduate UBC students (except those in Bachelor of Arts, who take ASTU 150) must complete first-year English courses. Before you can register in a first-year English course, students must complete the **Language Proficiency Index (LPI) test** or be exempted from it. Students must complete all sections and achieve a minimum score of level 5 (30/40) on the essay section of the examination. Exemption from LPI 75% final grade (blended) in English 12 or English Literature 12 or equivalent or 80% interim grade for a course in progress at the time of admission. This is based on the marks sent by the ministry in May. <http://www.english.ubc.ca/ugrad/1styear/faq.htm#1>
LPI is NOT required for admission.

FACULTY OF ARTS PROGRAMS :If you're taking a program in the Faculty of Arts (BA, BFA, or BMus), you won't be required to register in First-year English *unless* you intend to pursue Arts One, or English major, or a minor in English. However, Arts students must fulfil the First-year Writing Requirement. You can fulfill the requirement in several ways, including by registering in the Coordinated Arts Program or Arts Studies 150. Registration for these courses doesn't require LPI, or exemption. If you're taking Arts One, or wish to take English as a major or minor, however, you must take First-year English. This requires that you pass the LPI (or qualify for exemption), before you enrol in the First year course.
