For Students Entering Grades 10 - 12 in the 2018/19 School Year		
<p><b>Grade 10 Students will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Graduate on the 2018 Graduation Program. In all Grade 10 subject areas, there will be full implementation of the Grade 10 Curriculum. All Grade 10 courses that students are enrolled in will have fully updated content with a focus on big ideas and core competencies, including Aboriginal content. Required courses include:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Physical &amp; Health Education 10</li> <li>Science 10</li> <li>Social Studies 10</li> <li>Math 10</li> <li>Language Arts 10</li> </ul> </li> <li>Complete Career Life Education (CLE), Career Life Connections (CLC) and complete the Capstone Project within their graduation years (Gr. 10-12) <i>Note:</i> Planning 10 will be retired June 30<sup>th</sup> 2018</li> <li>Complete 4 credits of Arts Education and/or ADST within their graduation years (Gr. 10-12)</li> <li>Write the Graduation Numeracy &amp; Literacy Assessments within their graduation years (Gr.10-12)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Grade 11 students will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Graduate on the 2018 Graduation Program. Required courses include:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Language Arts 11</li> <li>Science 11 or 12</li> <li>Math 11 or 12</li> <li>Social Studies 11 or 12</li> </ul> <i>Note:</i> There is flexibility with the SS 11 or 12 grad requirement in that students may take any new SS 11 or 12 course or any current elective Grade 12 SS course for which there is an IRP (Law 12, History 12, Geography 12, Comparative Civilizations 12, Social Justice 12). The last year these courses will be offered is 2018/19.             </li> <li>Meet the requirement for Planning 10/Grad Transitions (GT) – Career Life Education (CLE)/Career Life Connections (CLC) with any of the following combinations:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Planning 10/GT</li> <li>Planning 10/CLC + Capstone</li> <li>CLE/GT</li> <li>CLE/CLC + Capstone</li> </ul> <i>Note:</i> Grad Transitions will be retired June 30<sup>th</sup> 2019.             </li> <li>Complete 4 credits of Arts Education and/or ADST within their graduation years (Gr. 11–12) if not completed in Grade 10</li> <li>Write the Graduation Numeracy Assessment within their graduation years (Gr. 11– 12)</li> <li>Write the Literacy Assessment in their final graduation year (Gr. 12)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Grade 12 students will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Graduate on the 2018 Graduation Program. If students have not completed their Science, Social Studies or Math requirements, they must complete them in this year. <i>Note:</i> The last year Law 12, History 12, Geography 12, Comparative Civilizations 12 and Social Justice 12 will be offered is 2018/19.</li> <li>Complete Language Arts 12 (English 12, Communications 12, English First Peoples 12) and write the provincial exam in this year <i>Note:</i> The last year Language Arts 12 provincial exams will be written is 2018-19, and the last year Communications 12 will be offered is 2018-19.</li> <li>Meet the requirement for Planning 10/Grad Transitions (GT) – Career Life Education (CLE)/Career Life Connections (CLC) with any of the following combinations:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Planning 10/GT</li> <li>Planning 10/CLC + Capstone</li> <li>CLE/GT</li> <li>CLE/CLC + Capstone</li> </ul> <i>Note:</i> Grad Transitions will be retired June 30<sup>th</sup> 2019.             </li> <li>Complete 4 credits of Arts Education and/or ADST if not completed in Grade 10 or 11</li> <li>Write the Numeracy Assessment (if not written in January/June or August 2018)</li> </ul>
